Fadhil Badrani, a journalist and resident of Fallujah, told the BBC on late Thursday night (11 November): "There are more and more dead bodies on the streets and the stench is unbearable. Smoke is everywhere. A house some doors from mine was hit during the bombardment on Wednesday night. A 13-year-old boy was killed...Without water and electricity, we feel completely cut off from everyone else...It is hard to know how much people outside Fallujah are aware of what is going on here. I want them to know about conditions inside this city – there are dead women and children lying on the streets.

Twenty doctors along with dozen of Iraqis were killed by a US air strike on a government clinic on Tuesday (9 November) in the centre of Fallujah, according to Dr Sami al-Jumaili, who survived the strike. "In the early morning the US attacked the clinic, a place that we were using for treating the injured people in the city. A girl and ten-year-old boy, I really don't know if they want to tackle the insurgents or the innocent civilians from the city,"
